Feline Acute Pancreatitis -Updates on Diagnostic Workflow with Catalyst Pancreatic Lipase Test

Acute pancreatitis is a common disease in feline patients, often with vague and non-specific clinical signs. Acute pancreatitis may also be present with concurrent diseases, such as diabetes mellitus, acute kidney injury, or gastrointestinal diseases. This can further complicate the diagnostic process and make treatment more challenging.

In this seminar, we will provide a review of the current standard of care, and introduce the workflow and tools for managing feline acute pancreatitis:

Dr. Bill Saxon DVM, DACVIM, DACVECC

Dr. Saxon received his DVM degree from Iowa State University in 1986. He completed his internship at the Animal Medical Center in New York City, followed by residencies at the Animal Medical Center and University of Pennsylvania. He is board certified by the American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine and the American College of Veterinary Emergency Medicine and Critical Care.
